RULES

General

1. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be at the competition platform or circle, ready to play at the posted time or earlier if there are registered competitors who do not play ahead of you.
2. All participants at these games must be a member in good standing or a recognized piping and drumming association.
3. Competitors will compete in reverse order of entry.
4. All competitors, with the exception of chanter and drum pad must be attired in suitable highland dress.
5. No competitor will be allowed to start without a number to be worn on the front of the kilt.
6. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry and/or cancel, combine or split any event.
7. Communication with a judge with respect to any competitor, event or result may result in the disqualification of the competitor. The decision of the judge is final.
8. Grievances must be made in writing, accompanied by a fee of \$20, refundable if the protest is sustained. Grievances are to be made within 30 minutes of the time marked on the posted results of the event. A grievance committee will be formed for this purpose.
9. The competition will be governed by the Alberta Society of Pipers and Drummers (ASPD). These rules can be found at www.aspd.ca.

Solo piping and drumming

1. For pro snare and tenor you will be asked to submit tune lists, not drum scores, for your competition.

Pipe bands

1. Bands playing up will be required to pay the fee for their standard grade as well as half the entry fee for the higher grade. This also applies to bands playing up for only comments. Should a band place in the higher grade, it will receive the award for that grade and will forfeit any award that may have been due if placed also in the lower grade. Should such a situation occur, all other bands in the lower grade would retain their placing as judged. Requests to play up to a higher grade will not be accepted on the day of the games. Registration beforehand is required. It is at the discretion of the games committee to cancel playing up due to time restrictions.
2. Band rosters will be drawn from the ASPD web site one week before the games. For non-ASPD bands, please include roster with entry form.
4. Bands must participate in massed bands at the end of the day and be in suitable highland dress to be eligible for prize money.
